The same holds true with dog walking supplies, including leashes. The variety of options for specialty leashes has grown for both training and safety uses.

Some come hands free, these leashes have a harness that is placed around your waist and attaches to your dog's collar. Great idea for mom pushing a stroller or family member who loves to jog. For the more aggressive dog, harness leashes are made to control your dog with ease. These leashes are placed around the trunk of your dog, given you a better handle when they try and pull or run away. For the dog lovers who have more than one dog, double leashes are available so both can be walked at once. Whichever leash you decide to use, finding the right fit for you and your dog is the key to finding the perfect one.

What is Hands-free Dog leash?

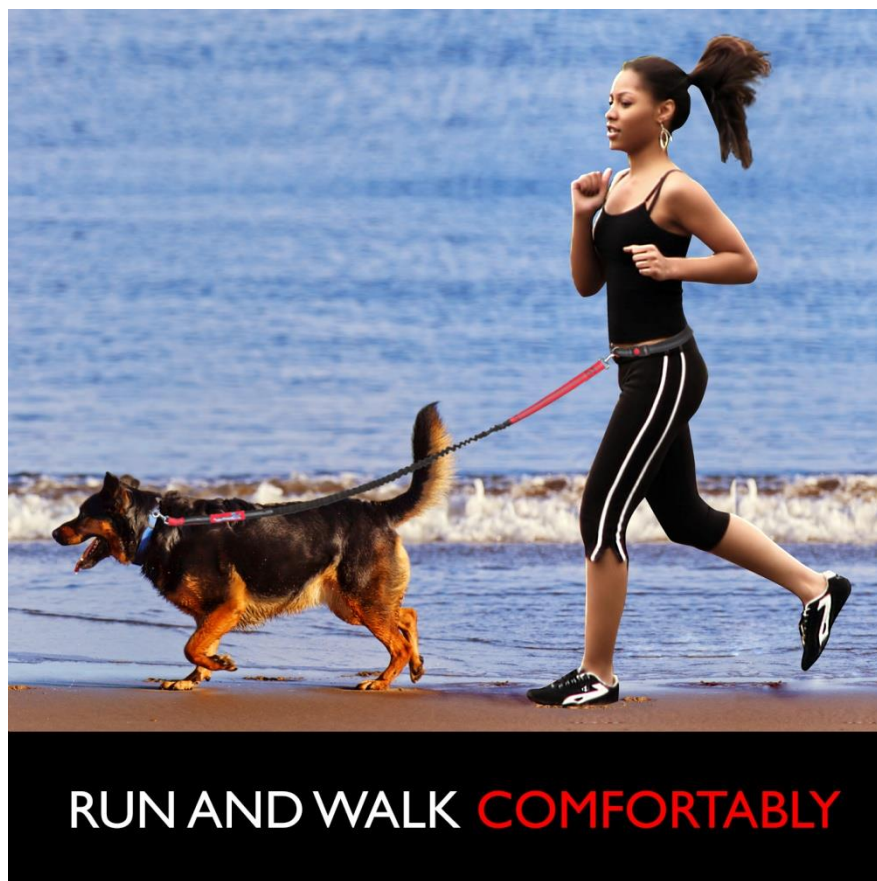


Hands free leash obviously allows the dog owner the ability to simultaneously leash and walk the dog while pushing a stroller, using a cell phone, running, etc. Bike leashes are also in this category, although it would seem leashing a dog to a moving bicycle for any length of time warrants additional consideration and possible concern.

Your dog is family. You always try to do what's best, whether deciding on the right food, treats, toys, etc. One of the great opportunities to bond and connect with your dog is on daily walks. Walking not only contributes to a dog's physical well being, but is also good for mental health. The stimulation from walking and moving forward into new territory reduces boredom and unwanted "bad dog" activities like digging and chewing. And using the right training approach and dog leash can make a big difference. Some experts will say that a short walk is better for a dog mentally than many other activities, such as playing in the backyard, even if you take more time doing so. While any activity is helpful, it's difficult to replace the many benefits you and your dog will discover from taking a couple of short walks a day together. Walking time is quality time where your dog is concerned.

The training time needed with your dog (assuming your dog is like most) for good leash etiquette, is one of the best initial training themes to initiate with your dog and you will find that the training and communication time with your dog during walks will be the basis for other training for good overall doggy behavior.

In fact, training good leash behavior begins even before you start the walk. When you pick up the dog leash, if your dog is too excited, put the leash back until he calms down. Begin the process over until he can stand still while you are preparing for the walk. This will seem tedious at first, but with a little patience and consistency, you will find that starting the walk calmly will improve your ability to train effectively during walk.



This is where the hands free dog leash comes into play. If your dog is already well behaved, and always in the same walking/training situation, you may be able to get by with a typical, four- to six- foot leash. Even so, there are other

things to consider like the right width and the material of the leash. Today, there are so many leash options, from retractable to hands-free, from shorter to longer, you can find the right leash equipment for the right dog and the right situation. You can even find lighted dog leashes for increased safety on those evening walks.

Leash training your dog helps to give them the exercise they need and they can learn quickly if the time and patience are invested.

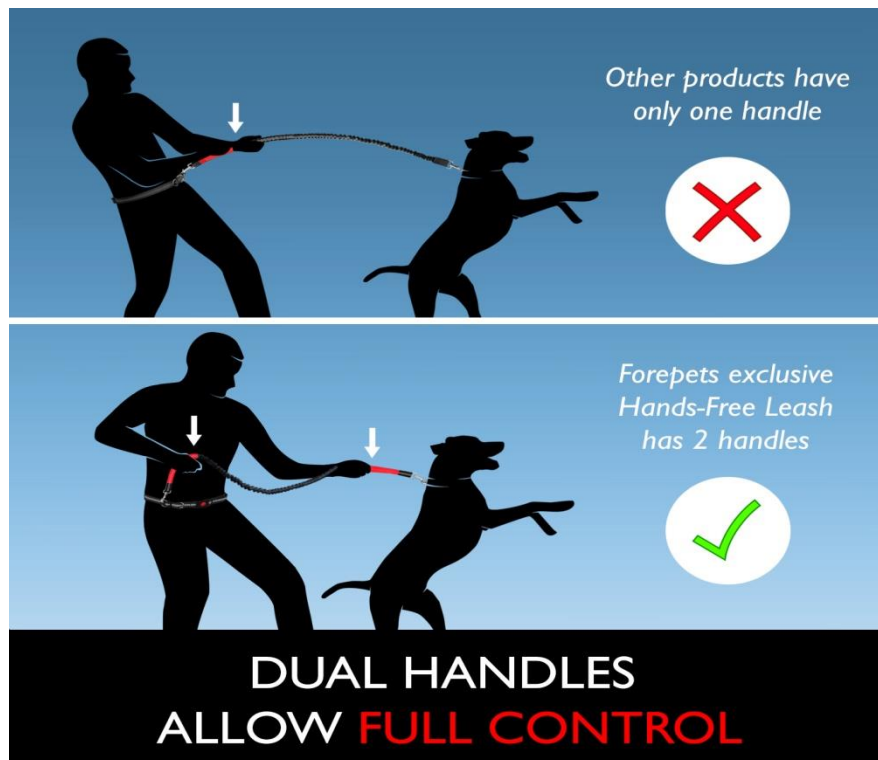
When beginning, it is best not to use a collar because it may result in an injury to your dog. For smaller dogs using a harness is most often preferred at all times and of benefit in early training. Dogs will also benefit by using a harness because they must learn not to pull until they become accustomed to the feeling of one.

After they have become familiar with their leash, then give them a word to associate with it to indicate that they are going out. It may amaze you how quickly they will learn to love the leash and become excited when it is shown to them. Encouraging them to sit when connecting it is another good training tool and this can be established quickly as well.

When beginning to walk be sure to keep the dog on one side of you depending on whether you are left or right handed. Hold the handle firmly, but also grasp it toward the middle to keep it stiff during training. Whenever the puppy is at the right spot, they need to be encouraged. Using treats and praising them for acceptable behavior will encourage it to continue to happen. There are things that will present themselves during a walk that can cause the dog to try and pull ahead and this should be expected. When this does happen; simply turn and begin walking in the other direction. From the very beginning it is important to let the dog know that you have control of the situation.

There will come a time when the extra hand will no longer be required on the leash to keep them in the correct position. They will stay in the designated spot until the unforeseen squirrel goes by. Even when this event does take place, continue training in the appropriate manner and just remember that they are dogs.

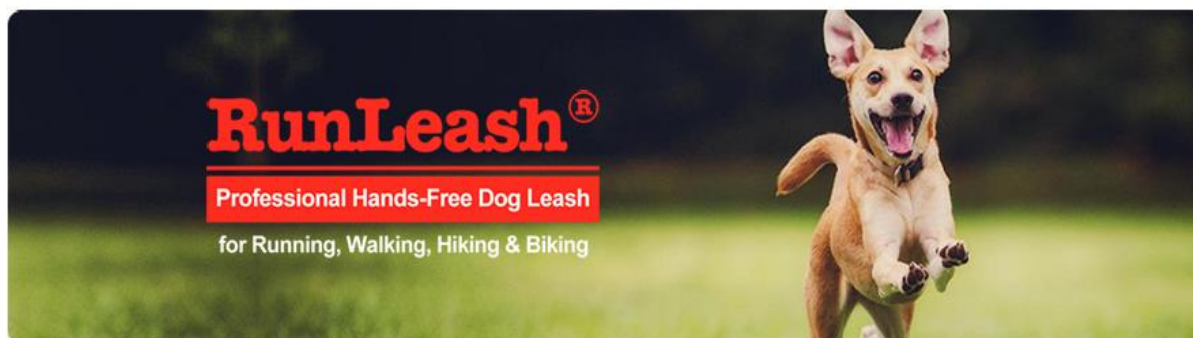

Some breeds that have been radically changed by man's selective breeding may not be able to travel as far, but nonetheless, they also need some sort of exercise to stay healthy and happy.

Exercise for a dog will also provide enough entertainment and enjoyment to curb bad behavior such as chewing, barking, running away and digging. These kinds of behaviors are directly linked to frustration and not having a way to expend pent up energy. Using a leather dog leash will ensure a strong lead for overactive, pulling dogs. Training should begin early with puppies in order to teach them most everything and this includes public walking.

Safety Tips

- Only use a hands-free leash with a well-trained dog that knows what loose-leash walking is.
- Pay attention to your dog and your environment. For example, if your dog chases squirrels, you should be paying enough attention to be able to grab the lead if they start to take off so you don't get pulled off your feet.
- Don't over-fill your hands. As mentioned above, you may need to grab your dog's leash if he starts to run, lunges at someone, or gets in the way of traffic. If your hands are full, you are going to be in trouble.
- Be Respectful. Most of these leashes give your dog a lot of extra freedom. Be watchful and make sure your dog is not pestering other walkers, getting into people's yards, etc.
- Watch the lead. Your dog can still trip you or other people! Your dog should know to stick one side of your body (no switching sides which is a leading cause of tripping) and to stay close to your side so you don't clothesline anyone.

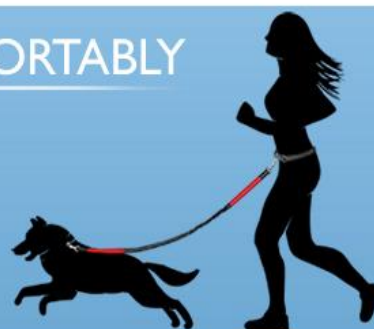
